What is dual credit?

- Dual credit is a process through which a student earns high school credit by successfully completing a college course.
- The final letter grade in the high school and college courses should be consistent.
- Students can take academic or workforce classes.

HISD's dual credit program

- Offered at 35 different high schools.
- More than 160 college courses have been completed for dual credit across HISD.
- 81% success rate (i.e., A, B, or C letter grade) for dual credit classes this past school year.

Who can take dual credit?

- Dual credit is open to 9th-12th grade students who meet the eligibility requirement(s) for the college course.
- Students must receive approval from their high school administrative team and parent/guardian.

What are the costs?

- Nothing! Textbooks and tuition are covered by HISD and HCC.
 - Students will need to address the abovementioned expenses if they take a college course without approval from their high school and/or complete the class on their own time (textbooks only).

What are the benefits?

- Exposure to college-level coursework while still in high school.
- Opportunity to improve high school GPA.
- Obtain college credit that can lead to the completion of a postsecondary degree or certificate.
- Did we mention that it's FREE?!?

How do I get started?

- Meet with the dual credit leader at your campus to discuss course options.
- Complete the ApplyTexas application to obtain an HCC ID#.
- Take the TSIA exam if you do not already meet the college readiness score standard for the classes you are looking to complete.
- Submit all dual credit paperwork by June 15th for fall classes (Nov. 15th for spring term).

How do I qualify?

- Students must meet college readiness score standards to take academic classes.
- Testing options:
 - PSAT/NMSQT exam
 - English II STAAR exam, Algebra I STAAR exam & passing score in Algebra II
 - TSI Assessment (TSIA) exam
 - SAT/ACT exam
- Students do not need to meet a score requirement to complete most workforce courses.

Keys to success in dual credit

- Read, read, read your course syllabus.
- Understand how to use all facets of HCC's online student system, including Canvas.
- Utilize the HCC resources available to you (virtual library, online tutoring, etc.).
- Communicate with your HCC professors.
- Remember your HCC usernames and passwords!

Final thoughts

- Students don't have to pick between dual credit, advanced placement, or IB classes.
- Certain 4-year colleges may only take a "A" or "B" letter grade, so don't overload yourself with too many classes.
- Withdrawing from a dual credit class avoids a failing/poor grade, but it may have future financial aid implications.
- Have fun being a college student!
